1. National Society Activities

- n Of major importance is our magazine, CQ TF, which is meant to be published quarterly. But editor position is vacant now.
- n IRA's web site (<u>www.ira.is</u>) is actively maintained in order to fulfill the members' need for the latest amateur radio news.
- n Amateur radio courses and examinations 1-2 times per annum.
- n IRA published a grand annual report under chairmanship of TF3JB, this has not continued.
- n IRA established for the first time an EMC committee in December 2011. The committee will seek a close relationship with specialized bodies of other national societies and the EMC coordinator.
- n IRA was the 2nd society in the world to translate and publish ON4UN's "Ethics and Operating Procedures for the Radio Amateur," in 2009. The booklet was distributed free to all members.
- n *QSL Bureau.*

Maintaining close relationship with the PTA is one of IRA's highest priorities. Among tangible results are:

- n Joint semi-annual to annual meetings between IRA and the PTA, discussing amateur radio issues.
- Now for decades IRA has composed and conducted amateur radio examinations in Iceland on behalf of the PTA.
- Secondary privileges on the following bands: (1) 493-510 kHz; (2) 5.260-5.410 MHz; (3) 70.000-70.200 MHz; and (4) 1850-1900 kHz (in certain international contests).
- Exchange of notes between IRA and the PTA prior to the WRC-2012 conference, where support of the Icelandic delegation was secured for the 472-479 kHz new band segment at the conference.
- n WRC-2015 discussed





As member of IARU/IARU-R1/NRAU, IRA seeks to be as active in the international radio amateur arena as possible, but that is limited for a such a small society and of such limited means.

Recent points include:

- A delegate was present 2011 both at the NRAU meeting and the annual Norwegian amateur radio event at Eidsvoll, which included NRRL's AGM and a meeting with PB2T. This was possible at low cost to IRA, due to NRAU's and NRRL's generous support.
- Organizing the venue for Region 1 EC meeting in May 2013
- This year 1 delegate to NRAU Finland and 2 delegates to Varna-Albena
- Increasingly in the last few years, a few IRA members, at their own cost, have been going to the Ham Radio Exhibitions in Friedrichshafen, Germany, which made possible for some IRA appointed members to be present at the informal IARU annual gatherings there.




Budget Limitations of a Tiny Society

- Though average per capita income in Iceland is high, IRA has limited means due to low membership count.
- **q** Full participation would cost a significant portion of IRA's annual budget.
- **Some** IRA members highly question the usefulness of such expenditure.
- Reduced financial support from the IARU Region 1 in recent years has made it more difficult than earlier for IRA to send a delegate to the 3-ennial R1 conferences.
- This may put pressures on the personal expenditures, which may not be sustainable in the long run.


Region 1 EC Meeting in Reykjavik May 2013

4. Club Activities

- n Our headquarters in Reykjavík are open to our members and those interested in amateur radio on Thursdays.
- n Many also bring their outgoing QSL cards and check for incoming cards, but the IRA QSL Bureau is located there.
- n Our club station TF3IRA QRV in HF and VHF is open to licensed members and in weekends for activating the station in international contests. Also run in some contests as TF3W.
- n The society offers an ambitious program of lectures and seminars that are given each year from February to May and from October to December. The total number of such events exceeds 40 per annum.
- n IRA owns and runs 4 VHF repeaters in around the country and has an APRS digipeater located at its headquarters in Reykjavík.
- n The society sponsors a TF Field day which is held annually in early August. This event first took place in 1979. A separate VHF field day is a new event.
- For a number of years the society has actively supported participation in the annual International Lighthouse Lightship Weekend.


New Members

- n ÍRA manages the radio amateur courses and conducts the examinations on behalf of the Icelandic Post and Telecoms Administration.
- n The PTA is more and more trusting IRA to conduct the entire examination and validation process
- n All teaching is volunteered from amongst ÍRA members
- n The courses are organized over 15 weeks, 3 hours twice a week, typically with a lecture on Tuesdays and solving problems on Thursdays
- n There is a separate exam for the radio theory and the regulations parts
- n Study materials include various handouts, old exams and additional material from the ÍRA study materials website
- n ÍRA have also videotaped the entire series of lectures, and made this available on our website as well
- New amateurs are encouraged to apply for a call sign, and are offered a one-year free İRA membership, although without voting rights
- There is increased use of the "/Qx" option to allow apprentices to get on the air; this only needs to be reported to the PTA but not applied for



Emergency Communications

- n Icelanders are fortunate enough to have a large corps of volunteer rescue associations, organized nationwide by ICE-SAR (www.icesar.com)
- infrastructure, and are currently moving into a TETRA-based nationwide communications system to be run in parallel with the VHF system
- n Consequently, the role of Icelandic radio amateurs is not as great as it would be otherwise
- n There is nonetheless interest among Icelandic amateurs to somehow make their mark
- n IRA established an emergency Mgr
- n Some Search and Rescue members have studied for amateur exam and obtained a license.







- Note the sounger generation of radio amateurs, who have never heard of amateur radio self policing think the older generation is too conservative and rule based by encouraging restraint in demands on the PTA
- n Main 2 subjects on their open agenda:
 - 1) Remote controlled operation and
 - 2) Apprentice licensing
- n May be a pretext top of an iceberg
 - n A group of dissenters has regular meetings
 - Some are talking about a 2nd society New IRA
 - Hearsay has it that some of them don't want any rules, all should be free and they talk of a battle between: Freedom and Progress against Conservatism and Backwardness
 - Hearsay has it, that they applied for membership of IARU
