

Antenna workshop




- LY team together with others participated in an antenna workshop.




YOTA Treasure Hunt

YOTA Treasure Hunt is a challenge where the competitors have a map with marked locations of 23 hidden hints and one treasure.




The participants are separated in several teams who are given instructions to find the questions that are related to amateur radio and YOTA events.



One team consists of five people who have to find as fast as possible the questions and answer them correctly. Giving the right answers to the organizers, each team gets a new location to search in for the next question and so on.

Important in the Treasure Hunt is that one runs as quick as one can in order to go ahead of the others, but other than that concentration is also vital — stop and look at the map or the question well before sprinting for it will only be of use.

The whole event ends when a team has been told where the treasure might be and, accordingly, finds it as well. The treasure itself is an unknown item that the teams have a vague description of. This year the description was along the lines of "a round and green item" and as it turned out - it was a watermelon.



The Treasure Hunt is an excellent exercise for team-building mainly because it requires a lot of

communication and coordination. It also combines physical with psychical effort and last but not least – having fun is granted.
