IARU REGION 1 GENERAL CONFERENCE

VARNA-ALBENA, BULGARIA 20-27 September 2014

The Conference is organised through four Committees C2 – Credentials and Finance (6 papers), C3 General Administration and Organisation (41 papers), C4 HF Matters (19) papers and C5 VHF/UHF and Microwave Matters (35 papers). There are also a number of Plenary sessions in the course of the Conference. There are just over 100 papers and they are available as zipped files at http://iarurlcon2014.bfra.bg/docs/conference-documents/ The meetings of the Committees are staggered so it is just about possible with two delegates to cover all of the meetings.

The **C2 Committee** is elected at the first plenary meeting of all delegates and consists of an elected Chairman and not more than one delegate from each of six different Member societies. The President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Executive Committee are ex officio members of the Committee to provide information. Any delegation head of a Member Society may attend meetings of this committee as an observer.

The purpose of the Committee is to establish the credentials and voting rights of delegations, to examine the financial situation of the Region including the audited accounts for the three years 2011 to 2013 as well as proposed budgets for 2015, 2016 and 2017. The cost of running the Region in 2013 was about €170,500.
